7. Viclink Plan Reporting

7.1 Goal 1 - Advocacy: To influence and inform decision makers

7.1.1 ACPL

John Murrell reported on the March meeting. Approval of the proposed Statewide Library Development Programs was the main item discussed. John had also presented the Committee with a short paper outlining the main issues for public libraries in Victoria at present.

7.1.2 MAC

The MAC is looking at long-term strategic planning for public libraries and has a project which was the subject of a presentation later in the meeting.

7.1.3 Department of Victorian Communities Report

A written report was circulated. The first round of Living Libraries grants has been announced. There is \$2.2 m left for second round.

7.1.4 State Library Public Libraries Unit Report

Written report circulated earlier. LBC reports are in the process of being distributed. A full set will be sent to each local govt. CEO and an Executive Summary to each Councillor.

7.1.5 MAV Library Policy Report

John Murrell reported that a policy document will be sent to the MAV Board and there will be consultation with relevant bodies at a later stage.

7.2 Goal 2 - Representation: To ensure representation at appropriate committees and organisations

7.4 Goal 4: Co-operation

7.4.1 Subcommittees

- Subcommittee meeting 4 May 2005. A meeting has been called for representatives of all subcommittees and the Viclink Executive to discuss plans for next year.

- Gulliver – Julie Rae

Costings for core databases have been sent out. We are still waiting for costs of some Bruce databases.

- Reference Co-operative –Teresa Wight
This group is re-considering its terms of reference.

- Collections Co-operative – Dale Cousens
Successful meeting held in Ballarat last week. This included a presentation by Sarah Hopkins on the new Beaumaris Library . Next meeting will deal with issues involved in importing NEL DVDs.

December meeting was held at Mornington. Next activity is a talk on Bookstart at State Library on 3rd May.

Last meeting was held at NILS. Committee is planning to send a questionnaire to all ILL staff to measure level and type of activity in ILL

7.4.2 Swift Project – J Binnion
Nothing further to report at this stage

7.4.3 Picture Victoria – J Rae
Funding will expire on 30/6/05. To continue to participate libraries will need to joint Picture Australia for \$3000 for the first year, \$5000 for the second. 16 libraries are involved and there will be a launch on 23rd June.

7.5 Goal 5 Finance: To ensure Viclink is a financially viable organization.

7.5.1 Kinetica: financial breakdown 05/06 – D Tyquin

Damian spoke about the need for the national database to be cleaned up as far as Victorian libraries are concerned. There was general agreement that we need to improve this in order to provide a more accurate database for our borrowers.

Proposed new subscription charges were circulated with 4 options – population plus collection size, population plus acquisitions, total Kinetica fee of \$170,000 or \$190,000 – to allow for increased usage. Members voted for Population plus acquisitions and fee of \$190,000.

7.5.2 Gulliver – J Rae

Members supported inclusion of Biography Resource Centre as a core database.

8. Other business

Karyn Seigmann reported that there will be a “Libraries” opening of new Beaumaris Library separate from the Official Opening and with champagne on 20th May at 4.00pm. Library managers will be invited.

10. Ministerial Advisory Council on public libraries: ***Future Plan for public libraries*** presentation by David Platt and Julie Rae

This proposal grew out of the MAC being requested to look at the Swift project and the Sydus proposal. David Platt was employed at a facilitator to help work through the issues.

A Vision Statement was produced – attached to these minutes and also a draft paper – The Way Forward . This was distributed at the meeting and will be available on the Infonet.

The proposal involves setting up a portal through which all libraries in Victoria (not just public libraries) can be accessed. This would involve a partnership between a number of key interest groups and a recognition of libraries as a guide through life.

It is planned to hold a workshop on 11th May to discuss the proposal with key figures in local government as well as in libraries. Members were asked to encourage local govt. CEOs and Directors to attend.

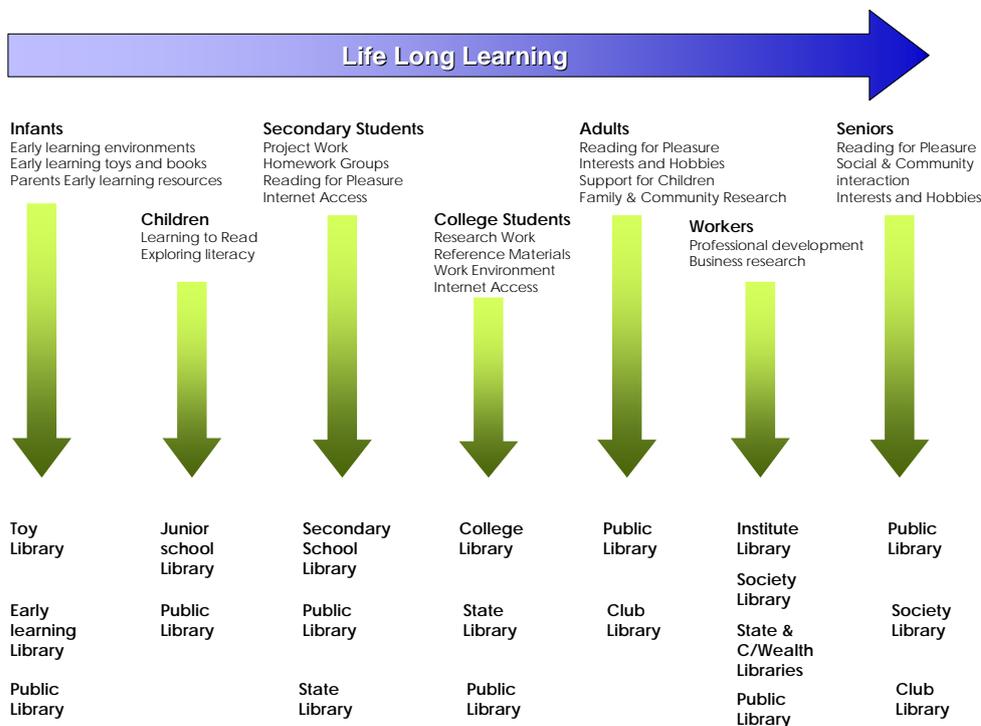


Figure 1. Life Long Learning Interactions with Library Organisations

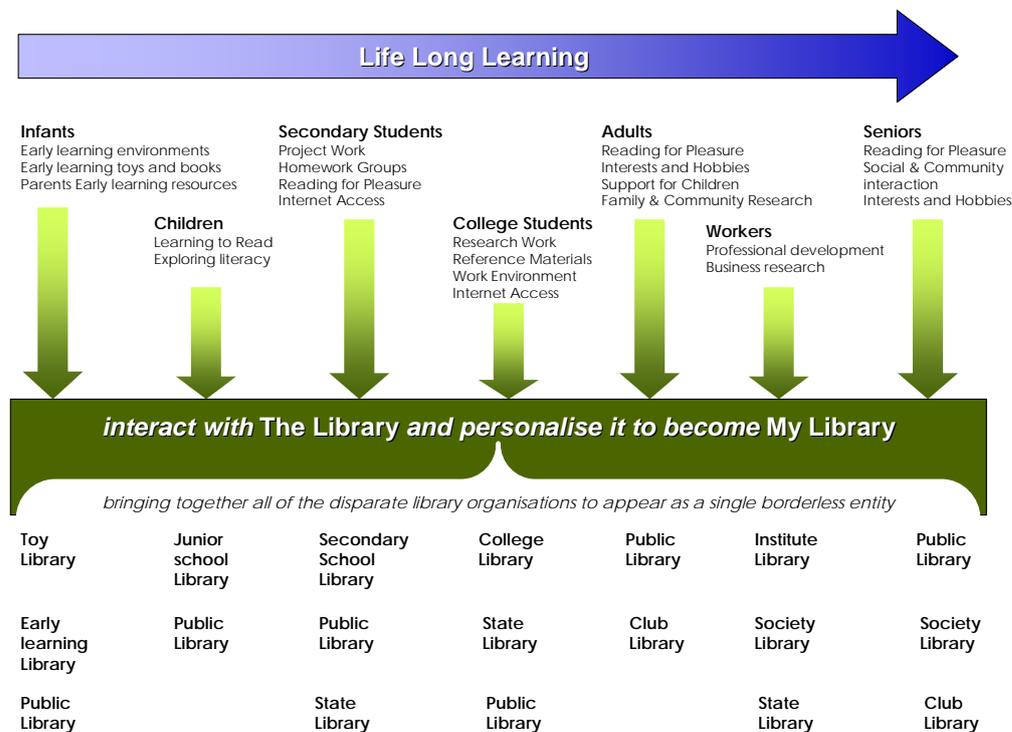


Figure 2. Library Organisations Collaborate to Create the Concept of The Library which User will Personalise to My Library.
